— ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION —

This building is composed of a simple two-storey brick front surmounted by decorative bracket frieze characteristic of late Victorian work between 1875 and 1885 and, despite later alterations to the ground floor openings, is of value to the streetscape.

This building does not appear on the 1874 Bird's Eye View of Port Hope but according to its architectural style was most likely constructed within the next decade.

It is a late Victorian simple two-storey brick building surmounted by decorative bracket frieze.

— HISTORICAL ABSTRACT —

As mentioned in the description above, this building does not appear in the Bird's Eye View of Port Hope and is thought to have been constructed with the next decade during 1875-1885.

The Insurance Plan for 1901 shows an office, bakery and dwelling at this location. The bake oven was in the rear extension. Keames Bakery was at one time located in the building.
